Integrated Systems thinking and modelling for public health: a practical focus on current issues

Many of our most important public health problems have proven themselves to be remarkably resistant to our collective improvement efforts. Deeply embedded structural drivers, webs of non-linear causality, and the social, organisational, and political processes of change, all influence the dynamic behaviour of our complex of health and social systems. Systems thinking and modelling is a broad methodology that offers conceptual and practical tools that can help organise dynamic complexity in a transparent way and support shared understanding of the consequences of policy choices and actions. With growing recognition of the interconnected, relational nature of emergent public health challenges, there is a proliferation in the use of systems thinking and modelling. They provide an opportunity to design more effective public health strategies that better account for feedback relationships, long-term uncertainty, and unintended consequences.
